It will help the parish council to reach out to villagers and impart information effectively

10 Risks considered and possible mitigations

Little to no risk as it is run as a page rather than a group, only administrators can post content and public comment can be restricted or turned off totally

11 How will the project be monitored and success measured?

All councillors can view the page and see interaction or villager's participation if required. The daily supervision will be myself and possibly one other
